

NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING

CLIMATE CHANGE ACTION PLAN OF THE CHALEUR REGION

The Chaleur Regional Service Commission invites anyone interested in climate change to attend one of the two public meetings where this topic will be discussed. In the coming decades, the population, properties, infrastructures and the natural environment will be more and more exposed to climate hazards, particularly seacoast and river flooding, coastal erosion, forest fires, ice storms and saltwater intrusion in water wells. With an eye to limiting the negative effects of climate change and helping municipalities and LSDs to plan efficiently for existing and foreseeable hazards, the Chaleur RSC intends to adopt a Climate Change Action Plan

The objective of these two public meetings is to provide the population of the Chaleur Region with information and raise awareness of climate change. The Commission would also like to hear from anyone who knows about or who has witnessed significant climatic events in the past. If you have historical documents to share such as photos, videos, newspaper clippings, please feel free to bring them along with you.

These meetings will be hosted by WSP, a firm retained by the Chaleur RSC to implement Phase 2 of the Climate Change Action Plan. These meetings will be held in both official languages and simultaneous translation will be provided.
